SOME INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT SOME OF OUR LOCAL HISTORY

A friend of ours, Dr. Gregg Wilkerson, recently retired as a senior geologist for the California Division of the Federal Bureau of Land Management, or the BLM (*not to be confused with the other BLM*). Jayne, KK6JPZ, and I just happen to have a copy of a 162 page "Field Guide" that Gregg wrote in 2017, called, **"Geology and Mining History of the Kern Canyon, Lake Isabella, Walker Basin, Kern County California"** (say that three times fast!) Gregg also teaches Geology at Bakersfield College.

Jayne and I were reading this field guide the other day, and came up with some facts Dr. Gregg covers in that book that you might also think are interesting:

- Did you know there was hydraulic mining (high-pressure water cannons to wash away the hillside, to get to the gold)

along the now Hwy 178 at Rich Bar? There was, and on page 31 of the guide, Dr. Gregg says, "The Kern river was diverted to the southeast so the river terrace to the northwest could be washed away to get at underlying gold-bearing gravels."

- Then, on page 34, he says, "Throughout this segment of the trip there are several white and blue/green road marker signs labeled "SAL". These identify nesting sites of the endangered Kern Canyon Slender Salamander (*Batrachoseps simatus*) found within the canyon from an elevation of 1,000 feet to 4,000 feet (305 to 1220 meters)." He goes on to say, the salamander is speckled grayish – brownish – olive in color and the largest species measured was 5.1 inches (120 millimeters) to the end of its tail. It is nocturnal during the moist periods November to May, and retreats underground during the dry season, searching for moist underground niches, or seepage areas. And, "These species are being monitored, holding up further Highway 178 development."
- Then on to page 40, where it says, "Old Kern River Road to Miracle Hot Springs. Miracle Hot Springs was closed due to health and safety violations by the Kern County Health Department. The hot spring waters are high in uranium and radon. Uranium is very common in granitic rocks. In the 1950's some people thought that small amounts of exposure to radioactivity was good for health." And on page 41, "Dahlonge Hot Springs waters as well as Miracle Hot Springs contain uranium and radon." The Dahlonge Hot Springs site is now on

PRIVATE PROPERTY, AND PERMISSION FROM THE LANDOWNER MUST BE OBTAINED IN ORDER TO USE THE SPRINGS. Dahlongega Hot Springs was on the old mule path up the canyon to the Hot Springs Valley (now the Kern River Valley), but was bypassed in 1976 when Highway 178 was opened up. Didn't matter much, the business declined and the hotel and hot springs were closed in 1912.

VE Exams & Licensing

As many of you are already aware the FCC has implemented a \$35 fee for the issuance or renewal of all radio licenses, this includes ham radio. We can still upgrade or modify our license at no charge. Modifications include address changes, name changes and email addresses on file with the FCC. At the time this newsletter is being prepared the FCC has put a temporary hold on processing amateur licenses due to problems with their computers and the new fees. Hopefully this problem should be resolved soon.

Our club sponsors monthly exam sessions on the third Saturday of the month and we process the paper work through the Greater Los Angeles Amateur Radio Group. GLAARG charges less than most VEC's and has a waiver policy for many applicants. The \$10 exam fee is waived for veterans, active students and first responders. Area Nets

Don't forget that we have a number of nets throughout the month. There is the oldest continuing net in the Kern River Valley each morning, except Sunday, at 9AM on the local 145.450 (-) 156.7PM repeater. This is the Prune Juice and Baloney Sandwich Net and it has been going on since the late 1970's or early 1980's. This is a friendly round robin net that usually goes two rounds. For those of you that live out of the area and can't get on the repeater directly you can hook up via Echolink by linking to KA6IYS-R. There is a delay using this method, but you should be able to hear the other stations and get in at the end of a round for your turn to talk.

Three nights a week we hold the Kern River Valley HF net on 75 meters. Our current go to frequency is 3.813Mhz in the general portion of the band. Most of us use a wire antenna of some sort and are horizontally polarized in the NVIS configuration. That makes the antenna easy to put up is good for nearby communications.

On Monday evenings at 6:45PM there is an Amateur Radio Emergency Services (ARES) net check in on 146.550 FM Simplex here in the Kern River Valley. If you miss this net and want to get checked into the weekly ARES availability count you can check in on the Breckenridge Repeater, 145.150 (-) 100.0PL at 7PM.

Sound Familiar?


Three older ladies were discussing the travails of getting older.
